### Weekly Classroom Highlight: Mrs. Lovern

In Spanish class over the past three weeks the students have learned many new things. Our vocabulary has expanded to learn places and things in a city and on a farm. Students have also learned directional words. In upper elementary and middle school, students created and labeled a map of a city and wrote directions to places on their maps.

Middle school students were also tested on their ability to conjugate all regular verbs in the present tense. Our focus in middle school over the next few weeks is utilizing our new vocabulary and verb knowledge to create complex sentences and even paragraphs.

During Holy Week (Semana Santa), students learned about the traditions during this special time in Spanish-speaking countries. The week is marked by solemn processions, special church services, and dramatic reenactments of the Passion. Countries like Spain, Mexico, Guatemala, Colombia, and Peru are especially known for their elaborate traditions, which often blend Catholic rituals with local customs. During class we were able to watch some of the processions in Seville, Spain live. The students were able to witness several pasos (the ornate floats), hear the music, and get a sense for what it is like to celebrate Semana Santa in Spain. Students also learned about the "alfombras" of Guatemala — intricate, handmade carpets crafted from natural materials that beautifully line the streets during Semana Santa.

We will end the year learning vocabulary focused on household items, different rooms in a home, and food and restaurant-related terms.

## Bonus Weekly Classroom Update: Mrs. Crawford

K-8 art classes are currently working on two and three-dimensional projects. Kindergarten students learned about drawings done 17,000 years ago in the Lascaux cave in France. We talked about primitive people's inventiveness in finding pigments for colors and making their own paint and tools. Students tried to figure out how the painters could reach the ceiling of the caves to draw and paint. We also talked about why the cave painters chose the images and why they were important to them. They are now working on their own

cave drawing using images like those drawn on Lascaux cave.

First graders learned how to make a clay pinch pot and apply texture to make it into a bird's nest. They learned how to form a piece of clay into a bird and eggs. After painting, they assembled all their pieces.

The Second grade is learning about how to make objects appear close or far away in a landscape. They learned about dividing landscape space into foreground, middle ground, and background through drawing different landforms. They are working on their own landscape drawing which they will display on a popsicle stick easel.

Third graders learned about Pop Art sculptor, Claes Oldenburg, and are making a Pop Art sculpture of a donut in papier mâché.

Fourth graders are working on a drawing based on the Cubist portraits of Pablo Picasso. They learned how to draw a portrait in the manner of Picasso by using different points of view simultaneously. They are using chalk pastel to complete their work.

The Fifth grade is working on a self-portrait. They learned the proportions of the human face, how to draw features, and applied that learning in their self-portrait. They are using chalk pastel to complete their work.

Seventh graders are building a clay coil pot and learning how to join clay pieces together.

The Eighth grade finished and displayed their clay fish before "Finding Nemo". They learned how to make a hollow form and use it as the body for their fish. They are now learning the processes of relief printmaking. They are currently carving a linoleum block before printing.
